knit our four hearts together and the relationship has continued to grow over these past two years. Listen to their hearts as they tell you how God has stirred them by seeing Billy's heart for these children.



"During their first trip in Africa-Kenya Billy surprised people when he came out of the vehicle in a crusade and started going round, touching the street and poor children and kissing them even before he got to the platform. This has never been seen where a white man can just interact and hang and kiss the African poor children. All in the crusade were touched by his love and this made us love him the more. On his stay here he had a chance to feed the street children and up to now they recall and keep asking of how he can visit them again. Because of his love and compassion he had for them, he and his wife had to give their supper to them that evening. This made them feel greatly loved. The tears of love that flowed his eyes preached volumes of mercy, compassion, and love to the poor children.

When he went back to America he sent money several times for feeding and buying clothes. He was so concerned about their security, health and shelter, for most of them live in streets and for this reason he had requested Peter whether it is possible for him to put up an orphanage. He had also requested if we can look for one or two orphans that they can adopt, but now we can help him not only adopt but to be a father to many by providing a home, food, clothes and education. Building a home for the orphans is giving a place for Billy's heart to remain a great blessing and a memorial. When we give to the poor orphans, we will be giving God a reason to open a well of resources that will never dry. A giving heart is God's heart. Be an answer to this cry and prayer."



The greatest mercy we have ever received is salvation. Join with us as we join Jesus at work in our world to take the word of salvation to all peoples. It is estimated that \$140,000 will purchase 5 acres of land, and build the orphanage, learning center and administration facilities. We would begin with space for 20-50 orphans.
